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MPIC's logistics unit preparing megahub in GenTri

MetroPac Movers Inc. (MMI), the logistics arm of Metro Pacific Investments Corp. (MPIC), has tapped Aboitiz Construction Inc. to develop a 20-hectare property in Gen. Trias, Cavite into a "mega" distribution hub.

MMI and Aboitiz Construction signed a memorandum of agreement for the development of the South Mega Distribution Center (South Mega DC), MetroPac Movers said in a press statement.

Initially, Aboitiz Construction will prepare the master plan and basic design for the development of South Mega DC, which will be built over a sprawling property purchased by MMI along the stretch of Arnaldo Highway.

DOH-Calabarzon forms task force vs. measles outbreak

The Department of Health (DOH) 4-A (Calabarzon) has formed a task force that will urgently address the rapid increase of measles cases in the region by beefing up its immunization program.

DOH 4-A Director, Dr. Eduardo Janairo convened an emergency meeting at the Vivaldi Hotel in Cubao last Feb. 11 to form the group, composed of all provincial, city and municipal health officers, National

DENR Calabarzon Regional Executive Director, lawyer Maria Paz Luma said all local government units (LGUs) need to expand their solutions to include finding economic uses on garbage or trashes.

"Many LGUs now can derive economic value from their wastes, we only need to increase demand," she said.

Apart from the economic-driven solution, the DENR suggested exploring the possibility of putting up a disposal facility per province through linkage with the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH).

It also stressed the recording, reporting and monitoring of cases for proper documentation and evaluation.

"This is also to ensure that we have enough supply of vaccines at the local level, including health human resource who will administer it to the target population," he added, emphasizing that

operate as each landfill only has a total capacity of around 2,193 tons of waste per day.

Based on data submitted by the LGUs to the EMIR, Calabarzon Region produces 5,695 tons of waste per day with a per capita waste generation ranging from 190 grams to 300 grams per person per day.

Cavite and Laguna rank the highest on per capita while Quezon has the lowest range which is lower than per capita volumes in metropolitan areas and mass tourism places like Boracay.

In their recent meeting with the DENR officials, the LGUs appealed that 100-percent efficiency in waste collection

could not be attained due to constraints in the number of operating dump trucks and manpower.

The discussions also tackled garbage collection services that are typically centered around the "population" (town proper) areas, and tipping fees in the landfills range from PHP7,000 to PHP15,000 per truck of wastes.

The Ecological Solid Waste Management law also requires that only residual wastes shall be disposed in sanitary landfills (SLFs).

Thus, stricter household monitoring of waste segregation will lessen these costs by up to half and any LGU breaching the law could face raps before the Ombudsman.

measles, polio, pertussis, and tetanus, among others, have been tested and proven safe, he said.

The DOH Regional Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit (RESU) has recorded a total of 972 measles cases from January 1 to February 9 this year, with 25 confirmed deaths.

SSS to hike contribution rate to 12% in 2019

This year, Social Security System (SSS) members and their employers will shell out more for their contributions as the rate will increase to 12 percent, a move that the state-run pension fund's chief said would replenish the fund life by six years.

SSS president and chief executive Emmanuel F. Dooc also said last Feb. 16 that the second

tranche of pension hike would unlikely be implemented this year even as it will still be granted within the term of President Rodrigo Duterte.

Dooc said the SSS will immediately craft the law's implementing rules and regulations (IRR), such that the provision mandating a 1-percentage point increase in the contribution rate every two

years, until it reaches 15 percent, can be implemented this year. At present, the contribution rate stands at 11 percent.

As such, this year's contribution rate hike will be followed by three more 1-percentage point increases in 2021, 2023 and 2025.

Under the SSS Rationalization Act, the Social Security Com-

mission (SSC)—the pension fund's highest policymaking body—can implement contribution rate increases even without the President's approval, unlike the current charter wherein only the chief executive can green-light rate adjustments.

Two thirds of the contribution rate increase will be shouldered by the employer.

Rice tariffication signed into law

The Rice Tariffication Bill has been signed into law by President Duterte last Feb. 15 amid opposition from farmer groups and consistent prodding from economic managers and business organizations.

The measure, con-

sidered a priority bill of the Duterte administration, will effectively open the country's doors to unimpeded importation of rice and provide an annual subsidy of P10 billion for the development of the rice industry. Economic managers and 13 business organizations had thrown their support for the law, noting that its enactment would help temper the country's inflation, bring down retail prices of rice in the market and harness the

country's ability to ensure food security.

However, industry groups, including the Federation of Rice Farmers, Alianza ng Magasindikat, and Rustic Regas, had urged Mr. Duterte to veto the bill, citing issues of smuggling and corruption in the rice trade as well as the limited role of the National Food Authority (NFA) under the law.

Under the tariff regime, the NFA would be limited to maintaining the country's emergency stocks in time of calamities and would not be allowed to license importers and regulate the entry of imported rice in the market.

It was not clear if it would still be allowed to sell subsidized rice in the market.

Acting NFA Administrator Tomas Escobar said details of the agency's function would be tackled in the implementing rules and regulations of the law, which has yet to be released.

The Rice Tariffication Law allows the market to be flooded with rice imports so long as these are slapped a tariff at 35 percent if coming from ASEAN members and 50 percent for non-ASEAN states.

Around P28 billion in revenues are expected to be collected by the government from these imports, which would be used to subsidize rice farmers to ensure their competitiveness.

Sen. Cynthia Villar, chair of the Senate committee on food and agriculture and the proponent of the bill, said that the money should be used to mechanize and modernize the sector, which has been lagging behind other rice-producing countries.

DOTr plans to integrate new railway lines

The Department of Transportation (DOTr) is working to integrate its new railway lines as it revealed a connection between its massive Metro Manila subway and the so-called North South Commuter Railway (NSCR) project.

Timothy John Batan, Transportation undersecretary for railways, said they were studying a possible connection between the subway project and the NSCR in Bicutan.

The subway will span more than 30 kilometers and will run from Quezon City to the Ninoy Aquino International Airport in Southern Metro Manila. The NSCR will run 147 km and will link the Clark Freeport Zone in Pampanga to Calamba, Laguna, via Bulacan and Manila.

The subway project, which has yet to begin, will also be connected to the Metro Rail Transit Line 3, MRT 7 to Bulacan and the Light Rail Transit Line 7 via the government's common station project in Quezon City.

The DOTr is expecting to finish the subway project by 2025, however, it committed to open the first three stations in Quezon City by 2022, or when President Duterte's term ends. The NSCR will also be opened in phases through 2022.

Both the subway and the NSCR will be mainly funded by the Japanese government.

Transportation Secretary Arthur Tugade said he would be flying to Japan last week to inspect the boring equipment that would be used to drill tunnels in the ground for the subway project.

The subway's groundbreaking date has been a moving target, however, Tugade said they were eyeing the ceremonial event on Feb. 26 this year.


