

Violty Gulapo of the DENR Ecosystems Research and Development Bureau (ERDB), who disclosed that since 1918, the country's mangrove forest has been largely reduced. Gulapo said their studies showed that "from a total number of 500,000 hectares of mangrove forest in 1918, this has drastically gone down to only 117,000 hectares in 1995" but increased to 257,362 hectares in 2011. She said that mangrove restoration may

be attributed to coastal rehabilitation programs implemented by the government, non-government organizations (NGOs), and the local communities.

Inflation hits 2-yr low; BSP seen to cut rates

Stable food prices, the stable price environment to further cut retail prices of rice, interest rates tomorrow [also] be cutting rates this Thursday," he said.

BSP Governor

Benjamin Diokno earlier told Bloomberg News that he saw up to 50 basis points worth of rate cuts for the balance of 2019.

Also, Mapa pointed to a year-on-year decline in prices of corn, sugar, jam, honey, chocolate and confectionery, while price increases eased for oils and fats, vegetables and other food products that month.

The increase in July 2019 rate of price increases "is consistent with the BSP's prevailing assessment that inflation will continue to decelerate in the third quarter before firmly settling within the target range of 3 percent, plus or minus 1 percentage point for 2019 and 2020."

"The main driver in the downward trend of inflation in July was food and nonalcoholic beverages," National Statistician Claire Dennis S. Mapa told a press conference.

In the case of rice, the Filipino staple registered a third straight month of declining prices—down 2.9 percent year-on-year in July, 1.7 percent in June and 0.7 percent in May, he said, noting that the last time that they dropped during the past three months, year-on-year was in June 2016.

The government had also attributed the dip in prices to the implementation of the Rice Tariffication Law widely expected by the market that the Philippines will take advantage of allowed easier entry into central bank will

cal economy a growth boost. In a statement, the central bank said the July 2019 rate of price increases eased for oils and fats, vegetables and other food products that month.

Besides food, Mapa said the other contributors to July's lower inflation included slower year-on-year increases in prices of firewood, charcoal and jeepney fare, while prices of domestic air fare, petroleum and fuels for personal transport equipment, electricity and LPG declined that month.

For his part, ING Bank Manila's senior economist Nicholas Mapa said the latest data provided evidence of a continued trend of slowing inflation in the Philippines.



Exports, imports down in first half

Merchandise exports rose for the third straight month in June while imports contracted also for three consecutive months, auguring well for second-quarter economic growth.

Even as exports inched up during the second quarter, the value of Philippine-made goods sold abroad during the first six months declined 0.8 percent to \$34.11 billion from \$34.4 billion, up 9.7 percent year-on-year.

Between January and June, the top three destinations of Philippine exports were the United States (\$5.61 billion, up 9.7 percent year-on-year), Japan (\$5.14 billion, down 1.8 percent) and China (\$4.59 billion, up 7.7 percent).

First-half imports declined 0.8 percent to \$2.47 billion.

Meanwhile, end-June imports declined by 1 percent to \$53.12 billion from \$53.63 billion last year. Since imports continued to exceed exports, the balance of trade in goods remained at a deficit, but narrower by 1.2 percent at \$19 billion in the first half from \$19.24 billion a year ago.

While imports from Japan and South Korea followed those from China, shipments from the two countries dropped 7.8 percent year-on-year.

In June alone, the value of imported products that entered the country dropped 10.4 percent year-on-year to \$5.01 billion and 20.4 percent to \$4.31 billion, respectively.

"Despite the challenging external environment, the Philippines' biggest decline so far has shown resilience in this year and reversing the 29.9-percent jump posted during the same month last year.

Call centers may not make it to DOF's tax perks list

Farm sector shrank 0.24% in 1st half of 2019

The agriculture sector contracted by 0.24 percent in the first half of the year due to a drop in crop production brought by the El Niño dry spell.

The latest report of the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) noted a 5.79-percent decline in the production of crops during the second quarter, which contribute almost half of the total farm output.

This dragged the minimal growth registered in the first quarter of 0.67 percent. For the second quarter, the industry shrank by 1.27 percent.

Palay and corn output fell by 5.82 percent and 8.73 percent in the second quarter.

Sugarcane posted the biggest contraction

respectively. The PSA said these were traced to the "decreases in harvested areas and yields in most of the regions because of the adverse effects of the dry spell/drought."

Other crops that posted declines were coconut, banana, peanut, mongo, cassava, sweet potato, tomato, cabbage and calamansi.

Consequently, the value of crops was down by 11.09 percent during the second quarter to P215.5 billion. This was also due to the decrease in the production of certain crops as farmers shifted to planting other

plants that were more profitable.

Livestock production, which accounted for 17.41 percent of total farm output, recorded a 3.22-percent increase in the second quarter.

The sustained demand for pork pulled hog production up by 4.1 percent, which partially offset declines in cattle and goat production.

Dar to tap private sector in irrigation plan
